

## **One-Day State Level Entrepreneurship Development Workshop**

The Post Graduate Degree Departments of Food Technology (M.Sc.) and Commerce (M.Com) of Carmel College organized a State Level Entrepreneurship Development Workshop in collaboration with the World Trade Center Goa on 18<sup>th</sup> February 2020, at Carmel College, Nuvem. The Workshop was attended by 90 participants. The workshop can be summarized as follows:

Mr. Blaise Costabir elaborated on the pros of being an entrepreneur. He emphasized on the qualitative aspects needed to build an entrepreneurial brand such as self-belief, and also elaborated on the lifestyle changes and the sacrifices that comes along with being an entrepreneur. He also stressed on the importance of networking and having a trustworthy partner with complementary skills. Mr. Ravindra Manerkar explained the difference between a conventional business and a start-up. He also spoke on the stakeholders involved in the start-up ecosystem and the role Incubation Centers and Co-working Spaces play in helping start-up to scale. He gave a brief idea about the access to service providers.

Ms. Joshna briefed us on the Chief Minister's Rozgar Yojana (CMRY) Scheme introduced by Goa's former Chief Minister Late Shri. Manohar Parrikar and spoke on attempts by EDC Ltd to help entrepreneurs start up. She also mentioned about the various services where in these schemes could be applied. Mr. Ashutosh Kumar educated us on the Bank formalities and documentation that one needs to fulfill as part of pre-registration process. He elaborated on the Factors of Production, Marketing Arrangement, and also stressed upon KYC, CIBIL, Credit Information Report, CMA data and Collateral Security. Mr. Cyril De Souza walked us through the basics of trade and the role the WTC plays in building one's business in international markets. He enlightened us on the role of WTC in expanding one's network in the pertaining market. Mr. Ashutosh Kharangate elaborated on the importance of finding the gaps and looking closer to find problems and create solutions for it. He gave us an insight into the strategies used by the "Unicorn" companies and also provided various suggestions that would help one evaluate and strengthen one's business idea.

Mr. Gavin Dsouza spoke on his journey from innovation to commercialization and explained the various innovations that helped companies soar skies and also embedded in us the importance of positioning and repositioning of products. He interestingly explained products designed for a particular function and how their modified functions have surpassed expectations. He has also spoken on the importance of forming solid partnerships and the business model canvas. Mr. Deepak Parab educated us on the State Patent Information Centre and the status of India among other global leaders, w.r.t. to patents filing. He also spoke on the various schemes that the Government of India has to offer. He also stressed on the gap between the number of publications we produce as a country and the number of patents registered and the importance of converting publications to patents. Mr. Parab also informed of careers in IP. Mr. Evencio Quadros took over the closing ceremony and spoke on the importance of the entrepreneurship.

Apart from the lectures, the workshop included a mini-fair, wherein entrepreneurs showcased their products such as plants, variety of wines, jewelry and handicrafts.

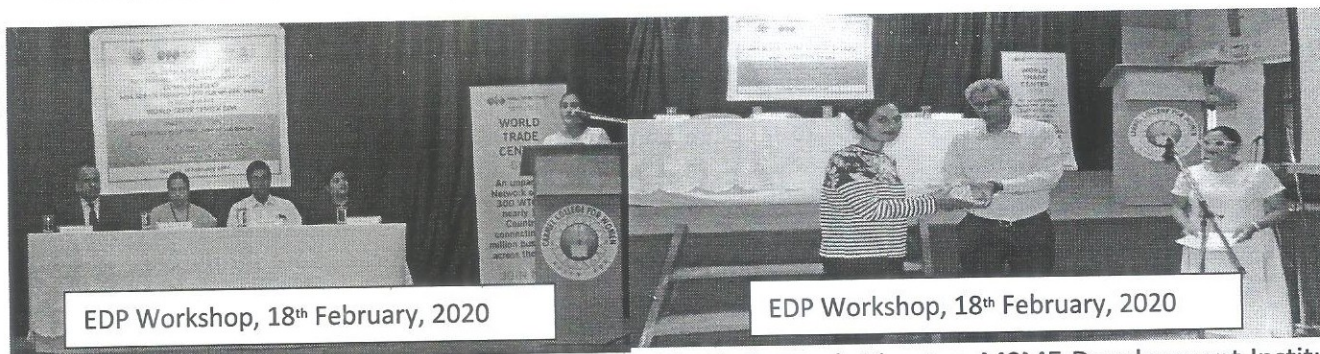

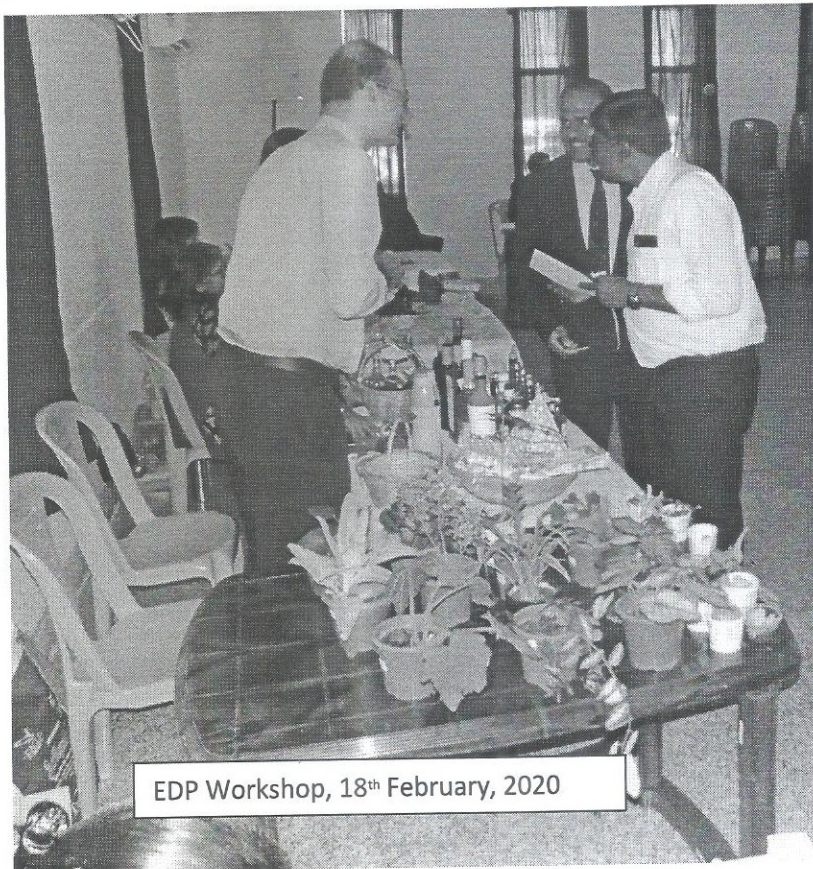


**Mr. K. Devaraj**, Director, MSME Development Institute,
