

In addition split grams of Black gram, Chick pea, Green gram, Pigeon pea & Red lentil also were displayed.

Each type of pulse was exhibited with common name / vernacular name, scientific name with family & medicinal uses along with other utilities if any. A poster was displayed with briefings on the significance of IYP-2016, nutritional value of pulses, general uses other than its food value, world production of pulses, etc.

Nutritive & healthy dishes were one among the attractions of the exhibition. Method of extraction of Soya milk was displayed along with freshly prepared Soya milk. Few art pieces made of pulses also stole the show. The exhibition was open to the staff & students of Carmel Higher Secondary School & College. 


